


Story Telling / Unique Leadership Perspectives


Why Leaders Tell Stories

- Fosters common understanding






The Story of Phil Knight

Storytelling - Neuroscience Principles

Your brain remembers:

- Pictures first
- Then it remembers emotional content
- Then it remembers language





Brain on Visuals/Storytelling

When we are told a story **Both the right** with rich and left sides meaning and are activated. visual cues, things change dramatically.






