What is User-Design?

User-design empowers front line users to design their own systems and innovations.



User-Design Works Best When:

- Expertise is not accepted by users
- User resistance to innovations exists
- Problems and issues are systemic
- Leadership supports a user-design approach
- Users are ready to assume design responsibility



Advantages and Challenges

Promotes faster adoption and diffusion

Encourages continuous improvement

Provides interesting opportunities for users

Promotes holistic and systemic change

Process may be disorderly and take longer to complete

User-design skills are required

Bad ideas or unworkable designs may result

May reduce costs



User-Design vs. User-Centered Design

<u>User-Centered Design</u>

- User feedback and expertise is solicited
- Decisions on design are left to expert designers

<u>User-Design</u>

- Users drive the design process and make critical decisions
- Users negotiate design with organizational leaders and designers



Facilitating User-Design

Lets go of "light bringer" mentality

Examines power issues


Facilitator

Ensures leadership buy-in, selects tools with users, and coaches users through the user-design process

Case Study: Curriculum Design

Background

- Systemic issues existed
- Different offices involved
- Different objectives existed with offices
- Expert-driven curriculum had languished



Team Selection

- Front line economists
- Mix of nonsupervisors and supervisors
- Organizational culture supported users taking responsibility



Action Research

- Users conducted needs analysis
- Users considered existing curricula
- Users gathered existing training data
- Team incorporated indiginous knowledge from users in their offices



 Users worked with delivery medium

Cooperative

 Users developed prototypes and mock-ups of curriculum
